Montgomery presented the fiscal office report as follows:

- Other agenda items will be addressed as needed

Hall presented the January road/cemetery report as follows:

Hedge presented the zoning inspector's report through January 22 which included the following:

No report was submitted from the sheriff office. Montgomery noted that bills for the sheriff contract have not been received from the county for several months; therefore, unpaid services from 2023 will be rolled into 2024 until billed. She will reach out to the county to resolve.

- Lutz reported Fire District calls as of the last meeting were 15 township, 68 village, 40 mutual aid, and total calls for 2023 was 2023, an increase of 17% over 2022.
- Nemet attended the EMA reorganization meeting on January 10th representing the township. Regarding Scott St., activity is on hold until January 29th. The contractor has started working on Spencer St., and the work in this area has gone a little more smoothly.
- Augusta noted that a quote is being sought for work on the cemetery walk bridge to be submitted to the county for ARPA funds. Nemet is seeking the quote; a brief discussion was held regarding the work that may be necessary. The engineer's plans from DLZ will be reviewed.
 Augusta suggested that some of the trees near the cemetery bridge should be removed to protect it from damage. Hall will look at the trees and get a quote for tree removal as necessary.

A brief discussion was held regarding the establishment of a uniform policy to replace Cintas uniform services. Montgomery noted that a policy outlining all guidelines and requirements should be established and the allowance would be a taxable income to the employees. She recommends allocating once or twice per year and designating specifically what each disbursement is intended for as well as the anticipated life of each clothing item. Augusta will work with Hall to develop a policy.

Montgomery briefly reviewed the GTSWMD Grant opportunities available for this year. A brief discussion determined that the township has no projects DIG Grant for tto benefit from DIG Grant funding for the recycle area; funds will be reimbursed to the township for the 2023 DIG Grant when the final work is completed.

\$2,623.00 will be available this year through the scrap tire grant which will be received by the township once applied for. \$3,500.00 is available through the Go-Green Grant for 2024. The township will apply for the funds for the purpose of funding toward clean-up and e-waste recycling collections if granted.

24.01.33 Augusta moved to schedule the 2024 Scrap Tire Collection and Spring Clean-Up for Saturday and Sunday, May 4 and 5, 2024 from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Second by Nemet.
